The Rise, Decline and Renewal of Buffalo's Parkway Neighborhood, A Model for America's Cities



Clinton E. Brown, FAIA

The fascinating story of how Buffalo's historic Elmwood District became one of American's Top Ten neighborhoods.

Clinton E. Brown is the Principal Architect and founder of CBCA, a Buffalo-based, nationally active full service historic preservations, architecture and grant services firm that is a significant leader in renewing historic places. Mr. Brown has led a career spanning the public, not-for-profit, and private sectors with architectural, historic preservation, and civic leadership at the local, state-wide, national, and bi-national levels. He has testified before Congress on transportation enhancements and has advocated on Capitol Hill and in Albany for historic preservation issues.
